	act of violence or other specified offense because of a belief or perception about your race,
	color, national origin, ancestry, gender, religion, religious practice, age, disability or sexual orientation.
	<ul> <li>If you have suffered bodily injury or an attempt with a dangerous weapon because of your</li> </ul>
	race, color, religion or national origin, you may also have suffered a hate crime under
	federal law.
	<ul> <li>If you have been the victim of a hate crime and you believe you were targeted because of your race or ethnicity in the wake of the COVID-19 crisis or if you have witnessed such an</li> </ul>

	resources are available to you.

	Why should I report a hate crime?
	<ul> <li>Reporting to law enforcement can assist in identifying and prosecuting criminals who commit hate crimes. This can also help prevent future crimes. There may be</li> </ul>
	compensation or other services available for victims of hate crimes.
	Reporting the crime can be helpful in bringing civil claims against those responsible for the
	anti-Asian harassment and violence, which can seek to recover damages for victims and changes in policies and practices.
	Reporting to non-governmental organizations helps them collect information to understand
	the scope of the problem, obtain the resources and services necessary to address the problem and effect policy changes.
